Executive Summary

ith its vision of Youth, Peace. Unity and Development, the Afro Arab Youth Council(AAYC) fosters youth active engagement through several programs, projects and activities that annually form its broader work plan. The council promotes strengthening of connections between African and Arab youth, encouraging collaboration through initiatives and partnerships.

This is the first quarter report of FY2024 /25. The AAYC was guided by key objectives, including enhancing its brand visibility, promoting ideologies of peace, unity and development, exploring partnerships with member organizations and governments, and developing comprehensive programs aligned with the objectives of the AAYC.

The accomplishments achieved within these three months include: Staff Development and Coordination: Media Engagements with along increased activity on social media: celebration of the International Youth Dav: building Strategic Partnerships with embassies, NGOs, and educational institutions. to enhance youth opportunities in education; peace, unity and mental health: Humanitarian Efforts in partnership with ICESCO and UNESCO. AAYC supported mental health services at Butabika National Referral Hospital, addressing urgent needs highlighted by alarming statistics on mental health disorders among youth in the Afro Arab region.

The AAYC is unwaveringly committed to promote youth interests within the Afro-Arab region and continues to expand its reach and impact, ensuring that the voices and needs of the youth are not only acknowledged but actively addressed.

About the AAYC

Afro Arab Youth Council was founded in 2004 at the conclusion International the Youth Festivals of the African and Arab Youth held in Khartoum auspices of the National Federation of Sudanese Youth, with support from the Government of Sudan. In 2005, an Executive Committee was formed for the African and Arab Youth Council, to follow up the legal mandate of the organization, vision, mission and objectives of the AAYC, and entire membership with the Africa Union and Arab League. With the sponsorship of the Government of Sudan, the Secretariat was established in Khartoum, while Libya Uganda, and other Governments provided other logistical support.

The AAYC has since widened its membership and grown to cover more African Countries especially through the National Youth Organization and National Coordination mechanisms, Youth Non-Governmental

Political Organizations and Youth Party Leagues. and Arab Countries through National Youth Organizations, Youth Non-Governmental Volunteer Organizations, Scout movements and Diaspora Youths Organizations.

In 2008, the AAYC Secretariat shifted from Khartoum to Uganda after the unanimous decision to construct the AAYC International Headquarters in Kampala, at the conclusion of the historic 2nd Afro-Arab Youth Festival, 2008. held at Munyonyo, Kampala. H.E. Y. K. Museveni also took over as Patron of the AAYC from Col. Maummar Al Qadaffi, and offered land for the International Headquarters, and the other member country Presidents have pledged to financially support the construction of the project

The major objective of AAYC is to work with existing Youth and other International Organisations to fight poverty, migrations, ignorance, disease as well as segregation as major youth problems hindering the progress of the African and Arab Youth, to promote exchange of study and scholarly opportunities for Youth of member countries for different institutions of higher learning and to serve as a legitimate representative and communication link of youth organisations at the regional, continental and international levels.

Strategic Focus For This Quarter

AAYC has different objectives and goals and for the first quarter, it focused on the following;

- To institute and streamline the AAYC brand identity and what it represents as well as brand visibility through Website upgrading, use of different social media platforms, weekly newspaper articles, staff organizational email addresses,
- identity and business cards designs.
- Promote AAYC ideologies of peace, unity and development through; institutions of Higher learning and youth organizations through regular debate and interactions
- Provide opportunity for consideration and partnership between AAYC and MDA's
- Develop comprehensive programs and plans based on organizational goals and donor requirements
- Create Policy reviews and analysis, monthly position papers and Advocacy strategies.
- Monitor, analyze and prepare social support and humanitarian development, disaster relief programs or emergency situations in given communities

Quarter 1 Activities and Progess (July -September 2024)

Internal Management Systems (IMS) Enhancement.

The AAYC believes in building a healthy management system as a key driver to achieve organizational objectives and mission. We emphasize internal organizational planning, supervision, control, organization and coordination as vital for our performance. Therefore, we are cognizant of providing opportunities to enhance our staff capabilities with skills, and platforms to realize our set goals and objectives. This quarter, we had several *staff meetings, trainings,* other internal administrative processes to foster staff performance and productivity.

Staff Trainings:

Human Resource Development (HRD) and Human Resource Utilization (HRU) form the core of AAYC's functionality. We value our staff and work constantly to skill, and retool their competencies with various knowledge and skill to further enhance productivity and performance.

This quarter the AAYC organized a staff training in "Effective Communication"; in which various systems of communication and approaches were facilitated by communication gurus to support AAYC internal and external communications.

Our Communications:

Communication is a key tool in achieving our vision and objectives as an organization. We strive to keep our constituents updated, guided, engaged and reached out through different communication approaches, quided our communication policies and strategies. proactively engaged quarter we social media, traditional media, and designed communication products in consonance with the vision of youth, peace, unity and development which core to our vision.

- Therefore, Weekly article writing publication in National dailies like the New Vision, The Monitor and online newspapers were introduced. and public. These were in form of blog posts, social media posts, and flyers. For example, several social media flyers were designed for engagements and information for the youth to create more awareness of the International

Youth Day, International Humanitarian Day, X Space, and International Day of People of African Descent. AAYC received more publicity on Television e.g. on Uganda Broadcasting Corporation (UBC), etc.

Member State Engagements and fast tracking of the fundraising process for the AAYC headquarter construction

s highlighted above in the "about the AAYC" section, that; In 2008, the AAYC Secretariat shifted from Khartoum to Uganda after the unanimous decision by the AAYC delegates to request Uganda to house the AAYC International Headquarters, at the conclusion of the historic 2nd Afro-Arab Youth Festival, 2008, held at Munyonyo, Kampala, to give the young organization a permanent home.

H.E. Y. K. Museveni also took over as Patron of the AAYC from Col. Maummar Al Qadaffi, and offered land for the International Headquarters, and the other member country Presidents pledged to financially support the construction project.

It is against that background that headquarter construction continues to form a core focus for the AAYC secretariat team and this quarter, key milestones were achieved:

The patron, H.E Y K Museveni President of the Republic of Uganda, having honored his commitment to allocate land for the Headquarter construction, went ahead and wrote to his counterparts in the Member states reminding them of their pledges to support the construction of the project.

Therefore, the AAYC secretariat team headed by the Secretary General embarked on a follow up

exercise, and visited the various embassies through whom the letters were channeled. This was very leading-edge and a profound engagement that presented many other opportunities further creating synergies for continued collaboration between the AAYC and the Embassies in fast tracking the Headquarter construction. To that effect, the following Embassy visits were engaged:

Embassy of United Arab Emirates

On the 29th August 2024, the AAYC team led by the Secretary General AAYC had the honor of interacting with H.E. Abdalla Al Shamsi, the UAE Ambassador to Uganda. Both parties agreed to foster a strong working relationship, with H.E. Al Shamsi pledging the UAE Embassy's support for AAYC programs.

The Ambassador pledged full support and collaboration on key youth initiatives through activities such as training programs, scholarships among others that benefit youth with in the African and Arab region. The Ambassador also expressed UAE government's commitment to supporting youth-centric initiatives for a stronger partnership with the Afro-Arab Youth Council.




Embassy of Sudan

During the meeting, the secretary General expressed AAYC's deep concern for the plight of the Sudanese youth, women, and children, who have been severely affected by the ongoing conflict in Sudan.

He further appealed for a peaceful resolution to the conflict, urging regional and international bodies like IGAD, the East African Community (EAC), African Union (AU) and the Arab League to exert pressure on the warring factions to ensure that peace talks continue.

H.E. Ahmed Ibrahim, the Sudanese Ambassador expressed his gratitude to the AAYC team for the continued efforts to see that the council continues to thrive. And further pledged his collaboration with AAYC for the restoration of peace in Sudan.

Kingdom of Saudi Arabia

The Secretary General of the AAYC and his team were hosted to a meeting with H.E. Mohammed Bin Khalil Faroudah, the Ambassador of the Royal Kingdom of Saudi Arabia to Uganda. The Secretary General briefed the ambassador through the history and activities of the AAYC.

The discussion between the two parties centered on conflicts in the region both in the African and Arab world and inquired from the Secretary General how the AAYC was helping to solve such issues. The Saudi Ambassador pledged to brief the leadership about the Afro-Arab Youth Council headquarter construction projects and that they shall respond according. He however welcomed the Council to continue collaboration with Saudi and shall ensure active participation of Saudi Youth in all activities of the AAYC.

Bilateral Engagements with Ambassadors and heads of missions accredited by Uganda to other countries.

The Secretary General Hon. Dr. Abbas Agaba led a team from AAYC on a bilateral engagement with Ambassadors and heads of missions accredited by Uganda to other countries. This meeting was intended to inform the ambassadors about the AAYC and its activities, and seek their support in mobilizing the AAYC member countries. The meeting also hinted on the fundraising drive for the AAYC International Headquarters construction and the need to create a follow up convention to ensure success of the process.

The ambassadors also appreciated the strategic importance of Uganda hosting the headquarters and how this can be leveraged on to reinforce Uganda's leadership

role in peace building and unity of the people within the Afro Arab region. It was agreed across the board in all the bi-laterals; that the AAYC secretariat shall propose a visit schedule to the different member countries the patron wrote to and the ambassadors pledged to lead in organizing for AAYC meetings with key stakeholders in their various mission countries.






Dialogues and other policy engagements.

One of the AAYC'S key strategies to build networks and amplify the youth voice in the Afro-Arab region is through dialogues and conferences. The AAYC organizes periodic dialogues, conferences, workshops and seminars to engage critical discussions on areas that are vital for Youth inclusion and perspectives. This quarter we organized a well-attended

XSpace Online Dialogue, **on** "**Skills Development for Enhancement of Youth Opportunities"**, it drew participation from across African and Arab audiences mainly; youths, students in higher institutions of learning, policy makers and practitioners, experts in digital skilling, researchers, academia, and the civil society; who discussed and made recommendations on skills Development and the need for governments in Africa to re-orient curricular towards skills acquisition among Youths in order to address the surge in unemployment rates and respond to the growing concern over the skills mismatch between the job market and graduates in African economies.

Hunanitarian activities.

Community social responsibility forms the backdrop of the AAYC across the board. We give back to the community in many ways, but this quarter the AAYC in partnership with the ICESCO and UNESCO Uganda, conducted a humanitarian support to Butabika hospital in commemoration of the Mental Health Day.

Preservation of the dignity is all human kind is key to attaining peace, unity and social cohesion among communities.

Butabika Hospital Donation

Recent statistics indicate that mental health disorders are prevalent, with rates of 22.9% in children and 24.2% in adults. Notably, among adolescents secondary schools. show significant symptoms of depression. These statistics therefore highlighted the urgent need for effective mental health support in Uganda.

On 09th September 2024, Butabika National Referral Hospital received a generous donation from the Islamic World Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (ICESCO) in partnership with the Afro Arab Youth Council (AAYC) and the Uganda National Commission for UNESCO.

This initiative aimed to support mental health services and enhance the hospital's capacity to provide quality mental health care. The Partnership undertook a significant initiative to enhance mental health services at Butabika National Referral Hospital in Kampala, Uganda.


